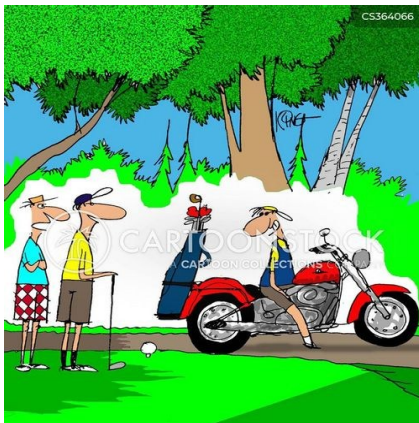
Golf Course Vandalism ~ Non-Emergency San Diego County Sheriff ~ 858 – 868-3200

To help prevent the continuing e-bike-related vandalism on the golf course, additional chain-link barricades will be installed at the end of Volney Lane, similar to the existing barricade at the edge of the parking lot near the entrance by the 2nd tee.

Signs will be posted explaining that HCV has a Letter of Agency, known in San Diego as a Trespass Arrest Authorization. This legal document authorizes the Sheriff to act on HCV's behalf and allows law enforcement to remove trespassers from the property when no HCV representative is present. If you see kids riding e-bikes on the course, or damaging the course in any way, please call the Sheriff's office immediately. You do not need to contact anyone from the recreation club or golf committee.

San Diego Country Fair ~ June 10th to July 5th

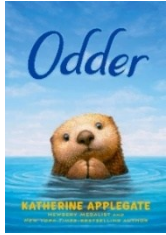

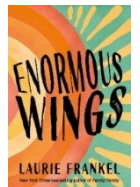

Topics during Q&A included Amazon delivery days, reminders that solicitors are not allowed, newsletter submissions through Roni Robbins, differences in pool rules, permit inconsistencies, clubhouse lighting, and better collaboration between the HOAs and Rec Club to improve vendor pricing and services. Many residents stayed afterward to continue conversations and ask additional questions. Overall, it was a great turnout.

The USA 250th July Celebration needs donations of cakes for the cake walk.
Here is a very easy recipe that even no-cook, no-oven, no-bake Lani could bake.

What you need:

- 1 white cake mix (plus ingredients listed on the box)
- 1 box (3 oz) cherry Jell-O
- 1 box (3 oz) berry blue Jell-O
- 2 cups of boiling water (1 cup per Jell-O flavor)
- 1 container (8 oz) Cool Whip whipped topping, thawed
- Red, white, and blue sprinkles



Instructions

BAKE THE CAKE: Prepare the batter as instructed and pour it into a greased 9x13-inch baking pan. Bake for 25–30 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Let the cake cool. A warm cake is more likely to tear or crumble around the holes. A completely cooled cake will be more stable, allowing for cleaner, more defined holes.

PREPARE THE JELL-O: While the cake cools, dissolve each Jell-O flavor separately in 1 cup of boiling water. Stir each one until completely dissolved and set aside.

POKE THE CAKE: Use the handle of a wooden spoon, a straw, or a skewer to poke holes across the entire surface of the cake making neat rows, spacing them about 1 inch apart and poking all the way down through the cake.

ADD THE COLOR: Carefully spoon the red Jell-O into half of the holes and the blue Jell-O into the remaining holes. Alternate the colors for an even distribution. Use a clean spoon for each Jell-O color to avoid blending the colors together. A purple cake is not patriotic. Gently tap or tilt the pan to help the gelatin settle. Cover the cake and refrigerate for at least 3 hours, or overnight for best results.

FROST AND DECORATE: Once the cake is completely chilled and the gelatin has set, spread the whipped topping evenly over the top. Finish with a generous amount of red, white, and blue sprinkles.

Encinitas Sister City Program

The Encinitas Sister City is the Japanese city of Amakusa. This summer four high school students will have the unique opportunity to represent the youth of Encinitas and to immerse themselves in Japanese culture. Participants will have the chance to experience life in Amakusa firsthand by staying with host families, engaging in cultural activities, and forming lasting friendships with their Japanese counterparts. The trip includes airfare, trip lodging, and homestay accommodations throughout the approximately eight-day duration.

Last year six student delegates and two adults from Amakusa stayed with Encinitas host families and experienced local culture, civic engagement, and outdoor recreation. With generous support from community partners and volunteers, the delegation experienced Encinitas through signature activities that showcased civic pride, creativity, and our coastal lifestyle, including: Surf lessons at Moonlight Beach with Concept Surf, Skateboarding sessions with Olympic skateboarder Bryce Wettstein, a Padres baseball game experience in San Diego, A hands-on art class and intimate music experience at Pacific View Arts Center, A classic American BBQ hosted by the Encinitas Fire Department, Community dinners, beach volleyball, and day trips that connected delegates with host families and local youth.
